

Visit their model town house, enjoy refreshments, and celebrate the conversion of the blight of the neighborhood to an attractive housing complex.

The Art of Fused Glass, a benefit lecture by Ted Sawyer Sunday, May 2 at 7:00 pm at Pratt School, 66 Malcolm Ave SE

A slide show and lecture presentation by Ted Sawyer, the Director of the Bullseye Glass Company's Research and Education Department, is being sponsored by the Bullseye Glass Company in cooperation with J. Ring Glass Studio in St. Paul, MN. All proceeds from the sale of tickets and donated art works will be given to PPERRIA to help fund the second phase of the nomination of Prospect Park to the National Register of Historic Districts. This designation will prevent the destruction of Pratt School.

Ted Sawyer offered to give this lecture as a fundraiser for the Prospect Park historic designation because he was raised in Prospect Park. He attended elementary school at Pratt, where he was a member of the last class of 6th graders to graduate from that school. He went on to graduate from South High School and from Lewis & Clark College in Portland, OR. Ted has taught in the U.S. and in countries around the world. His specialty is now kiln-formed glass, and his position at the Bullseye Glass Company has given him opportunities to work in collaboration with some of the most renowned glass artists in the world, including Dale Chihuly and Narcissus Quagliata.

The slide show Ted will present gives examples of projects he has worked on with artists who have visited Bullseye Glass. He will explain the work and methods of emerging and master-level artists in a process that encourages the development of new materials and approaches in a cooperative effort where the artist and manufacturer work in unison.

FARE FOR ALL

A new form of food cooperative has a site at St. Francis Cabrini Church. Fare for All stands for Food And Resource Exchange. It is a non-profit volunteer-based cooperative food buying program that allows people to stretch their food purchasing power. Food is purchased by the truckload and savings are passed on to its members. Individuals pay from \$12 to \$20 (depending upon number of items) each month for a package of food items, from frozen meats and entrees to fresh fruits and vegetables, with a value of up to \$25-\$40.
