Notice of Proposed Reallocation NRP Funds

On March 27th, 2023, PPA's Board of Directors will vote on a motion to reallocate \$25,000 from the existing Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP) phase 2 "housing" (loans/grant, 1A-C.1A-C) to the Tenants' Rights priority.

Background: The "Tenants' Rights Project" educates renters in the wider Prospect Park community on their rights and connects them with resources available should their rights be violated. Project activities include research and data collection, events, student and community meetings, focus-groups, and workshops, collaboration, and the creation of resource materials. The reallocated funds will primarily be used to hire a part-time Tenants' Rights Community Organizer to continue implementing PPA's NRP tenants' rights project, established by PPA community and board members and approved by Neighborhood Community Relations (NCR) in 2020.

2023 Board/Community Meeting Schedule

PPA will hold regular Board/Community meetings on January 23rd, March 27th, May15th, June 26th, August 28th, October 23rd, and December 4th. The Annual Meeting will be held May 15th. All are welcome to attend. Although regular Board meetings will no longer be held in February, April, July, or September, community meetings will be scheduled as the need arises. PPA will also issue fewer newsletters this year. These changes will be evaluated throughout the year and revised if necessary. PPA made these changes because City of Minneapolis neighborhood organization "base" funding decreased to \$10,000 this year. As a result, PPA has significantly less staff support available. On a positive note, fewer board meetings might make it easier for some community members to serve on the board.

To keep board and community members informed about PPA committee activities, committee minutes will be emailed monthly to board members and staff will have them added to PPA's website. If a board action is needed between regular meetings, the Board can vote electronically without a meeting or call a special/emergency meeting. For electronic board votes without meetings, the appropriate committee will prepare and email background materials to staff, Staff will email the materials to the board and have them added to the website. Since 1976, FamilyWise has pursued their mission: to strengthen families by promoting the safety, stability, and wellbeing of children. The nonprofit has locations in Prospect Park in Minneapolis and also St. Paul.

Born and raised in Airedale, the West Riding of Yorkshire, England, Arthur Maud studied singing at an early age and was chorister and soloist in local churches until his family emigrated to the USA in 1948. He has studied composition in Germany (Hochschule für Musik, Munich 1956-7) and America with Dominic Argento, Paul Fetler, Harold Genzmer, Carl Orff, Leroy Robertson, Leo Sowerby, and others.

He composed Sinfonia concertante for Organ and Orchestra for the PhD at the University of Minnesota in 1977. As Director of Concentus Musicus Minnesota he prepared and directed more than twenty years of concert seasons for its vocal and early music ensembles and produced nine recordings, three with international labels.
