Notes from the president

hen the quality of life is threatened in Prospect Park it does manage to get the neighborhood's attention. So it was with the latest concerns over increased freeway noise resulting from the I-94 detour around the fallen I-35 bridge. Prospect Park residents numbering over 100 at the November PPERRIA meeting let it be known to MNDOT officials and to Senator Pogemiller and Representative Kahn that the noise is unacceptable, and demanded sound abatement.

But this kind of citizen involvement is an old story in this neighborhood, and it is why we are known throughout the city as an informed and activist neighborhood. It is therefore surprising that according to our current bylaws, Prospect Park has among the most restrictive membership rules in the city. In fact, PPERRIA is one of very few neighborhood organizations that is not eligible for the city's Citizen Participation Program. This is one of the reasons why the Board of Directors charged a task force, chaired by Paul Zerby, to review our current bylaws and make recommendations for revision.

Paul's task force has worked very hard (meeting 16 times) to come up with recommended amendments that will make the bylaws reflect better the current practices and also help the organization reflect better the neighborhood residents' desires and needs to maintain and improve Prospect Park. We will have a chance to review and discuss their recommendations at the next two PPERRIA meetings (January 28 and February 25).

The challenges for Prospect Park to maintain its neighborhood spirit and identity have often come from external forces, like the freeway and the University of Minnesota. It was some 40 years when John Jamison, then President of PPERRIA led the fight to redirect the freeway path, intended to go through the Park (and Pratt School), to its current route along the railroad.

The University of Minnesota is another old story as it slowly creeps through the Motley neighborhood toward Prospect Park. The redevelopment of industrial land north of University Ave is yet another old story as

this land becomes more attractive to residential developers (note the JPI development now defining a clear border between Minneapolis and St Paul behind KSTP).

These old pressures continue to mount as new ones are added in the form of a proposed LRT along University Ave and proposed new parkway (completing the Grand Round) along 27th Ave. All these changes now underway and those being planned mean that we need to be more alert as a community and figure out how we can adapt to these pressures while preserving the quality of life that is unique to Prospect Park.

PPERRIA can play a role, and we want to have as many neighbors as possible engaged in the effort. Recently, PPERIA held a workshop for the members of the Zoning and Planning and Transportation Committees, and PPERRIA representatives to the SEED Committee and Central Corridor Cooperative, to begin some discussion about how we can proactively meet the many challenges.

The 24 workshop participants on a snowy Saturday December morning heard talks from Councilmember aide Robin Garwood about how the city is organized to address development issues; from the PPERRIA president and from committee chair Florence Littman about what PPERRIA does and has been doing; and from Dean Lund on the Southeast Minneapolis Industrial Plan, John DeWitt on the 29th Ave Station Plan, Dick Poppele on the University of Minnesota Impact Report to the Legislature and the University Partnership Alliance; and from Brian McMahon about the University corridor and its development in Minneapolis and St Paul.

In the discussion that followed, a number of critical issues were identified. Discussion continues on how we can best use the resources we have and find additional resources to help us make an orderly transition to the future of higher residential density and increased urbanization that is coming our way. 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PPERRIA Membership and Board of Directors Meeting
Monday, October 22, 2007, 7 p.m., Prospect Park United Methodist Church

President Dick Poppele called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. following a social gathering . President Poppele welcomed the many visitors and introduced Sen. Larry Pogemiller and Rep. Phyllis Kahn and MNDot representatives Tom O'Keefe and Chris Roy. Many residents of East River Terrace and East River Mews were in attendance.

- 1. A motion to approve the amended agenda was made by Mary Alice Kopf. Passed without noes.
- **2**. A motion to approve the October minutes, after an amendment by President Poppele was made by Florence Littman. Passed without noes.
- 3. Sound Walls for East River Terrace and East River Mews: The subject of the evening's meeting was to learn the impact of the additional lane on I-94 due to the I-35W Bridge collapse on MNDot's plans to build sound walls on the south side of I-94. Joe Ring began the discussion with a brief history of the efforts to obtain sound walls in this part of the neighborhood. MNDot maintains two lists of proposals for remediation: the first is of those projects completed before 1997, the second those completed after that date. Whether the added lane on I-94 is temporary or permanent is the pivotal question. If permanent, a new Environmental Impact Statement, including noise impact would be required. The new lane has reduced crashes, according to MNDot, and keeping the new lane after the bridge repair could be MNDot's position. Discussion ensued about the measurement of noise, and the time that measurements are taken. Residents say that the noise is highest at night when there is much truck traffic, not at peak traffic hours when the speed of the traffic is slow because of congestion. The MNDot officials said that they would be glad to do additional traffic monitoring, but would not state that they would measure at other than peak traffic times. Factors to be taken into account by MNDot are noise level, number of homes, and the length of wall required.

Kahn raised the possibility of acting through the federal government's funding request for the bridge reconstruction. Pogemiller stated that he thought funding might be available as part of a state transportation bill. Kahn, Pogemiller and Ring will meet with MNDOT officials in the near future.

Joe Ring stated that the National Council for Preservation Education advised that PPERRIA apply for "consulting party status" with the Department of Transportation in relation to the I-35W bridge replacement project, which includes detours and emergency measures. Such status would require that PPERRIA receive copies of all correspondence about the bridge project. Dorothy Davey moved that PPERRIA apply for consulting party status, passed without noes.

- **4. Zoning Committee:** Florence Littman reported on a joint meeting with Como residents, and of the University's plans to update its 1996 Land Use Plan. There will be future meetings. She described a point system that enables approval of one-to-four-unit buildings based on complying with certain recommendations of the City which results in shorter planning commission agendas. Julie Wallace reported that the University is no longer interested in purchasing the KSTP property for a parking lot.
- 5 Announcements: Andy Michel noted there will be a Grand Rounds meeting Feb. 12.

A motion to adjourn was made by Clay Lambert. Passed without noes.
