January Community Meeting - Neighborhoods 101

for everyone who cares about Prospect Park or What you need to know to get stuff done in the neighborhood.

Everyone who lives in Prospect Park is invited to join PPA Board members at **6:30 pm on January 28th** to learn best practices to follow while we are working to improve and protect Prospect Park—to help ensure we reach out and are inclusive. A representative from the City of Minneapolis will be present to talk about the basic responsibilities of a neighborhood organization and its board, funding mechanisms, (note - big changes in store for 2020), and how the commuity members can be involved. This is an opportunity to provide guidance for the board as we reform in the new year.

Here are some questions you might get answered:

- a) Why you are automatically a member of PPA and can participate and vote at committee and annual meetings (no need to "join" or pay membership dues, as in the past),
- b) Why PPA meetings must be open to the public and you are welcome and encouraged to attend,
- c) What you can expect of PPA board and committee members,
- d) What are the types of projects and outcomes the city encourages?
- e) What are the city expectations and guidelines for PPA and all city funded neighborhood organizations?
- f) Why must PPA reach out, be inclusive, and engage you and other neighbors, especially those not traditionally involved, in setting neighborhood priorities, influencing city plans, policies, procedures, programs and services, and increasing involvement in civic and community life?

YOUR voice is important in the discussion. We hope to see you on the 28th!

Conservation District

What is a Conservation District?

Conservation Districts allow neighbors to preserve the character that drew them to a neighborhood. It gives them legal tools to influence preservation, remodeling, removal, and development options for housing, commercial buildings, streetscapes, and landscaping. Conservation Districts are created by those who live and own property on adjacent streets in a neighborhood. Neighbors work together to create guidelines. One goal is to be good neighbors to one another. A Conservation District is not a historic district. Conservation Districts are governed by Minneapolis Code of Ordinances relating to Heritage Preservation: Heritage Preservation Regulations.

Join neighbors for a conversation about forming a Conservation District for parts of the Prospect Park neighborhood along Clarence and Seymour Avenues.
