Resolution of Support for Bicycle/Pedestrian Bridge

A motion from the Transportation and Land Use Committee of PPERRIA to pass a resolution as follows will be made at the March 26 meeting:

The Prospect Park- East River Road Improvement Association (PPERRIA) strongly supports the construction of a bicycle/pedestrian bridge crossing the Mississippi River parallel to the existing railroad bridge between Lake Street and Franklin Avenue . As the eastern terminus of that bridge, the neighborhood would be well served by the connection to the hugely successful Midtown Greenway which currently terminates at West River Parkway . The bridge will also enable and encourage expansion of trails to the east into St. Paul and Ramsey County .

The proposed twin tower suspension bridge should be sensitive to the ecology of the Mississippi River gorge while promoting non-motorized transportation in our region.

(Funding for the \$12.000.000 cost of the bridge is available through the Park Board.)

PPERRIA Membership and Board of Directors Meeting

Monday, February 26, 2007, 7:00 p.m. PPUMC

- 1. President Joe Ring called the meeting of the Association to order at 7:15 p.m.
- 2. A motion to approve the agenda, as corrected, was made by Mary Alice Kopf. Passed without noes.
- 3. Tony Garmers moved that the minutes of the November 27, 2006 and January 22, 2007 be approved. Passed without noes.
- 4. **SAAG Report:** Dick Poppele reported that the report had been approved by the City Council and the University Board of Regents and had been forwarded to the legislature. At a meeting with State Senator Larry Pogemiller, he indicated that a demonstration project might be proposed, but was not enthusiastic about a request for \$30,000,000. University President Robert Bruininks has appointed Kathleen O'Brien and Richard Pfutzenreuter to the continuing SAAG committee, and the University will hire permanent staff for the group.
- 5. **Sound Wall Resolution:** Efforts to deal with the sound issue at the East River Mews and East River Terrace continue. A University of Minnesota class will conduct a sound study, and report. The City of Minneapolis Environment Committee chaired by Dean Abrahamson with support the efforts if the sound study warrants.
- 6. **Zoning Report:** The Citgo station redevelopment plans were approved by the City Council, which overruled the decision of the Planning Commission. Clay and Mia Lambert thanked PPERRIA and supporters for letters and e-mails in their support. They presented Florence Littman with flowers for her efforts on their behalf. The new station will be named Metro Petrol. Dick Guilyard has proposed a development committee to study actions to guide development along University Avenue.

Bob Sykora has requested approval of a variance for the construction of garages at 1717 Franklin Avenue SE. He has plans for extensive renovation of the property.

Joe Ring requested that a committee work on created conditions for approval of student oriented housing in the event more such housing is proposed for the neighborhood. The Zoning Committee will undertake preparing them.

Florence reported that the City is proposing a pedestrian oriented overlay zone for the area along University Avenue. Such a zone prohibits drive-thrus, fast food, and reduces parking

requirements.

The City Community Engagement Report was responded to by a group of neighborhoods with a letter proposing changes that required more input from neighborhoods.

The Youth Performance Company wants a variance for an outdoor sign on the fact of the Art and Architecture building on University Avenue.

A demolition permit is being requested for 2019 Franklin Avenue. This property is a contributing property to the proposed Historic District. Contact with the city's Historic Preservation Board will be made.

Possible tenants for the Tower Grocery site are a veterinarian, a yoga studio, and a non-profit organization.

- 7. Molly Barnhart announced that she will be opening **Overflow Espresso Café** at 2929 University Avenue SE in the Prospect Park Professional Building in May. It will feature light lunches and a patio with a view of the planned rain garden at the site.
- 8. Roger Kiemele questioned why the neighborhood had not included exterior home improvement as part of its NRP plans, and noted the need for such improvement in a number of homes in the neighborhood. Discussion ensued, and Dick Poppele, who is working on such plans for NRP II, stated that he needed people to become involved to make it happen.
- 9. A motion to adjourn by Tony Garners was passed without noes.
