Notes from the President:

ur February meeting discussion about PPERRIA's future was a beginning to an ongoing conversation. One encouraging message: we have willing volunteers who want to know what they can do to help. I believe the PERRIA committees are key to tapping into this community resource.

We are fortunate to have people in our community with expertise in community issues. We saw how this can work for us with the presentation by our Planning Committee at the November 2008 meeting. This committee has professional planners and architects working alongside recent and long-time residents and business members. It has also been working closely with the University Alliance Planning Group to coordinate PPERRIA planning with that of the City, University, and other Southeast neighborhoods. The result is the start of a Master Plan that will guide how we face future developments.

Currently, we have 10 standing committees working on issues ranging from zoning, land use and planning, to transit and transportation, to livability and to basic PPERRIA business. Most of the committees were active in a number of issues this past year. Committee meetings provide the basis for volunteer involvement. Whether a committee has regular meetings or agendas depends in part on whether the committee chairs have the time to organize meetings and keep track of the issues.

As I have pointed out before in this column, the list of issues affecting Prospect Park livability grows almost daily. It is not possible for a few PPERRIA officers or active committee chairs to keep up with them all and to respond appropriately. The only way we can succeed in doing this is to spread the workload and make it possible for busy people to

help. We need to strike a balance between depending on a few active residents to "take care of things," on the one hand, and a more broad-based participation that involves more residents.

I will make broader engagement my priority as President by proposing some committee reorganization and by trying to recruit committee chairs who will effectively engage our community. Currently I think we expect too much from a relatively small number of stalwarts who have long been at the forefront of PPERRIA. While this has worked for us, it is unsustainable if we do not bring new people into the process. I believe that a longer term solution will require more paid staff time to provide day-to-day support for committee chairs. Currently, the time-consuming aspects of committee functions such as keeping track of issues and correspondence – and also organizing and staffing meetings – tends to hinder effective community activity. We need to make this easier and more effective.

The new bylaws we adopted in June outline different ways of doing business than we were accustomed to in the past. Starting with the approaching annual meeting in April, the Executive Committee membership will consist of the four PPERRIA officers (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer), the immediate past President and the chairs of the Standing Committees. This means that the committees will drive the PPERRIA agenda. The Committee Chairs will take issues to the Executive Committee and then to the Board. Helping to make these committees more effective will be key to PPERRIA's success in maintaining the livability we all cherish for our neighborhood.

PPERRIA Membership and Board of Directors Meeting Monday, February 23, 2009, 7:15 p.m. Prospect Park United Methodist Church

- 1. President Dick Poppele called the meeting of the Association to order at 7:05 p.m.
- 2. A motion to approve the agenda was made by Dick Kain. Passed without noes.
- 3. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Dick Kain. Approved without noes.

4. Committee Reports:

Zoning: Florence Littman reported on the report authored by Rachel Ramadhyani, which was due before the Zoning Committee or Board meetings. The thrust of the report was that the University needed to pay more attention to its relationship with the surrounding communities with earlier sharing of plans, establishing University boundaries. David Preus moved ratification of the response. Approved without noes. Paul Zerby moved that the University be urged to collaborate with the City and the Alliance on addressing binge drinking in the University area. Passed without noes. Bob Kaar moved that the ZPPR Committee work on the problem of shifting home ownership to rental housing and mini-dorms. Passed without noes. Other items facing ZPPR: setting a limit on liquor licenses in University area; changing administrative review standards; changing the relative homestead law. The Heritage Preservation Committee has proposed new language. Adoption of changes has been postponed. There will be two public meetings on the issues. The committee will deal with a variance for a garage at 68 Barton, and use of part of land as a parking lot at 64 Bedford.

<u>Livability</u>: Joe Ring reported on upcoming meetings at St. Anthony Park on March 19th regarding the Franklin Avenue traffic, bikers. Hennepin County has requested Prospect Park to nominate persons to represent it on a task group to study the Franklin/East River Road intersection. Volunteers included Phil Anderson, John Wicks, Dave Johnson and Dan Cross.

<u>Transit Committee:</u> John De Witt presented information on the results of an ad hoc committee with Prospect Park, St. Paul Districts 7, 11, and 12 who studied trucking alternatives for SEMI and the Intermodel BNSF facility. The group had assistance from University United and U-Plan. The group came up with three alternative truck routes, a 280-Energy Park Drive connecting, the missing link bridge, and the Wabash truck route. John proposed a resolution: Whereas Minneapolis' Prospect Park neighborhood seeks to connect the proposed Granary Road with roads that provide suitable access to Hwy 280, I-94, and other roads in St. Paulo while minimizing truck traffic on University Avenue; and whereas St. Paul neighborhoods in districts 7, 11, and 12 share similar concerns about truck and commercial traffic, therefore be it resolved that PPERRIA agrees to work collaboratively with, and in support of other community organizations in finding common solutions to our shared concerns about traffic that will meet individual neighborhood needs and visions for their futures. Passed without noes.

<u>Education Committee</u>: Susan Larson-Fleming outlined the proposal of the NRP Education Committee to release NRP funds for the redesign of the Pratt playground which will be voted upon at the March meeting.

<u>Planning Committee:</u> Dick Gilyard thanked the membership for their comments on the plan that was presented at the January meeting. The group will come back with a revised plan in two or three months. He noted that the University's group proposing an Ambulatory Care Center had approached PPERRIA asking what the community wanted.

<u>Central Corridor Community:</u> Phil Anderson announced that the District Central Corridor Collaborative was sponsoring a "Summit" to come up with solutions to issues surrounding the light rail development on University Avenue on Saturday March 7 and Sunday March 8.

NRP Report: Peter LaSha reported on an NRP meeting to determine representatives to be selected for a board to replace the NRP Advisory Committee. The meeting was to select a process to reduce the representatives from 81 down to 8. Peter pushed for a person from the southeast area. Another meeting will be held.

By Laws Amendment: A vote of the Board was taken on Dean Lund's proposal to amend the By-Laws to limit PPERRIA Board membership to residents of the neighborhood. The amendment passed with 27 yes votes to 8 no votes: Voting yes were: Wanda Alexander, Phil Anderson, Richard Brownlee, Tom Clausen, Robert

Estes and Matthew James, Bridget Ferguson, Susan Gottlieb, John Holmquist, Gail Hughes, Tamara Johnson, Dick Kain, Kimberly Kensinger, Ginia Klamecki, Christina Larson, Peter LaSha, Florence Littman, Dean Lund, Dorothy Marden, Andy Mickel, Ann Munt, Karen Murdock, Dan Peters, David Preus, Joe Ring, Joan Schneider, Julie Wallace, John Wicks. Voting no were Richard Adams, David Coats, John DeWitt, Kate Donahue, Tony Garmers, Walt Jacobs, Meredith Poppele and Paul Zerby. Four board members were absent.

Future of PPERRIA: Dick Poppele, Steve Cross, Joe Ring and Steve Banks led a discussion on the future of PPERRIA. The many issues facing the community were presented: Dick spoke about PPERRIA's finances, Joe Ring addressed the issue of volunteers, Steve Banks spoke about sustainability, and Steve Cross laid out the possible solutions. Their discussion pointed out a need for additional finances and the need for additional staff time to do administrative overhead work. Much discussion ensued from the membership. Further discussions will be held.

Announcements:

Dick Kain announced a Station Art Committee meeting.

Steve Cross announced the DFL Caucuses to be held March 3.

April 22, 10 a.m. there will be a showing of Frost/Nixon.

March 11 there will be a meeting at Pratt regarding parks, schools, and the City. 7:00 to 8:30.
