At PPA, we submitted three grants for funding from the U of MN Good Neighbor fund. Keep your fingers crossed! The projects include funding to support SE Seniors COVID-19 pandemic and beyond; a new fall event at the tower to welcome U of MN students with music, free food, engagement and voter registration (we'll need to follow all state COVID-19 protocols with creative accommodation); and a photographer-led project (see Dan's walkway photo above) to document through portraits of Prospect Park residents "Love and Isolation" in COVID-19 times. Thanks to all who worked on these grant proposals.

PPA received a \$1500 grant from the U of MN Good Neighbor Fund to support Census efforts to increase the count of those who are historically under-represented in the Prospect Park Census count.

I'll be taking a one-week staycation: a less-exciting replacement for my cancelled March trip to Paris and northern France. Gardening, weaving, walks, and home projects will fill my time.

We all need help from time to time - let us know.


If you find yourself in need of assistance due to the impact of the coronavirus pandemic, please fill out a Request for Help form (click here).
