#### **Notice to Prospect Park community**

Announcing two motions for approval at the PPA October 26 Board Meeting:

- 1. A motion to roll forward the NRP strategy called "NET Program" from NRP phase to NRP phase 2.
- 2. A motion to reallocate \$5,000 into the "NET Program" strategy (\$693.42 from Historical District Completion and \$4,306.58 from Loans/Grant/Affordable Housing Development). Approval of these motions will allow PPA to fund a "Learning Pod/Learning Dreams" program for low-income children and their families in Glendale. The project was approved by PPA's Board of Directors. The project was specifically requested by residents—and meets a need that has been identified by families and educators alike.

# **PPA Census outreach update**

Prospect Park Association has been working to reach under-counted communities in our neighborhood, specifically Glendale Townhomes residents and renters.

PPA's census activities included:

- Distributing census materials in Somali and English to Glendale Townhomes
- Making Somali and English-speaking Census representatives available to Glendale Townhomes residents
- Distributing over 3,000 flyers to 20 large apartment buildings and hundreds of small apartment units
- Mailing a postcard with census information to all Prospect Park households, including all the large apartment buildings

This year's census count has been negatively affected by the pandemic. Most students left their apartment prior to the April 1 count day - and most did not return to buildings in Prospect Park this fall.

So far this summer and early fall, I have been able to participate in a number of very deep, nuanced, important conversations about the future of community safety in our city. Some of the best were by special invitations with with small groups of neighbors in their backyards or nearby patch of public green space. Other powerful conversations happened more recently during National Night Out parties. These small gatherings showed me that valuable small in-person discussions can be accomplished using COVID-19 safety precautions.

Now, as fall is upon us, I want to have more of these discussions, at the same small scale, block by block.

To do that I need your help.


These block events are an opportunity for people to ask me questions about what's happening about community safety in Minneapolis, and for us to ask each other about our ideas, feelings, and hopes for what public safety in our city should look like and could look like in the future.

These kinds of small discussions allow us to really listen to each other, to understand and to hear how much we share. In this time, when it is easy to see the large divides between us about policing and public safety, I believe that there is a deeper consensus that also needs to be found, focused on and built upon. By opening our minds and opening our hearts to each other we can take the next steps together to keep us all safe now and make sure we are all safer into the future.

Patti Christensen is a Hennepin County Master Gardener who transferred from Outagamie County, Wisconsin in 2014 when she retired to Minnesota to be near grandchildren. Between Wisconsin and Minnesota Patti has devoted 12 years to the program. She enjoys working with people and volunteers teaching classes, giving tours at the Arboretum, working with the Alzheimer's Growing Connections program and answering a lot of questions from people like you! Beth Beck has been a Hennepin County Master Gardener since 2016. She lives in Minnetonka where her yard is largely perennials - both sun and shade. She is slowly converting her landscape to more native plants with a focus on providing a nourishing ecosystem for pollinators and beneficial insects. Much of her volunteer time is spent in Adult Education and is currently on the leadership team as Adult Education Chair.

The biophilia hypothesis describes how humans are innately linked to nature and other forms of life. Gardeners know this feeling from how they approach the garden and why they are drawn towards working with plants. We will explore where this science behind where this intrinsic draw came from, and what it means to us today. A focus of the class will be on how to use nature to improve health and wellbeing. This class will be presented by two Master Gardeners from the University of Minnesota Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program.



Holding an important national election in the midst of a pandemic has complicated this important civic duty. Questions about how to vote, when to vote, and planning your vote are front and center on all media. Is there evidence of voter suppression or voter fraud in Minnesota? What are the alternatives to in-person voting? Is mail-in or absentee voting safe? Are there absentee ballot drop boxes in Minneapolis? Will my mail-in ballot count?

Michael Wall, Voter Outreach Specialist from Secretary of State Steve Simon's office, will be on hand to address concerns about absentee voting, voter fraud and more. Katie Lauer, the Communication and Outreach Coordinator for Minneapolis Elections and Voter Services, will explain the processing and security of absentee ballots, and LWVMpls Voter Services Chair, Marilyn Cantisano, will outline available election/voting volunteer opportunities. All speakers will
